This Term:

This term our topic is "Goodbye Autumn, hello Winter". We will be exploring the change in colours, temperature, shape of natural objects and weather all around us as the season of winter begins. Throughout the year, we will also be introducing children to one of our five senses and focussing more on one each term. This term we will be exploring our sense of hearing, listening to the sounds of leaves falling, fireworks banging, Christmas bells jingling and describing them. This is a lovely time of year for learning, as there are many special cultural events and occasions to be celebrated; *Diwali, Bonfire night, Remembrance Day , Birthdays, Advent and Christmas.* We will be learning through music, songs and language rich activities whilst offering a range of creative activities and opportunities to explore with their senses.

This term we will be reading and enjoying the texts Stick Man, A Little Bit of Winter and The Nativity Story.



We will be learning new words, songs and poems to support our communication and language skills and developing our skills in making relationships too.
